8. Incident Sharing

- An employee was stopped by a coworker while working without the correct tools for the job. **Lessons Learned-** Employees are looking out for each other.
- An explosion occurred 40 miles south of vernal on an H2S location.
- A top drive tool was screwed into the top drive with the plastic thread protector still on it, incident is still under investigation.
- A work over rig had a line part and the finger board came loose and dropped to the rig floor. **Lessons Learned-** Drops program is still.
- Coil tubing came out of injector **Lessons Learned-** Scott Walker
- Motor Vehicle backed into pipe rack on location it was determined that the driver did not follow policy utilizing a spotter- **Lessons Learned-** Personnel following policies and procedures
- Scott Walker expressed the importance in training spotters.
- Recordable injury while a spotter was walking backwards while directing the truck into position. **Lessons Learned-** Spotters should be stationary.
- Logging crane was driving on US HWY191 south and a pick up towing a camper trailer attempted to pass the crane. When the truck accelerated the camper started to fishtail and hit the logging crane over turning the passenger truck and trailer.
